We are pleased to report that the new energy infused in the Association of Marshall Scholars ("AMS") by former president Ted Leinbaugh during 2006 and 2007 is continuing into 2008. During this time, a number of organizational improvements have been implemented: An expanded board of directors and slate of officers was elected. New by-laws were adopted. A set of new and active committees of the board were established. Board and committee meetings have been held with greater frequency. A new AMS mission statement has been adopted. An annual solicitation of dues and contributions has been implemented. A professional administration service has been retained. The officers, directors, and contact information for AMS are included in this report. Additional organizational improvements are underway, such as an enhanced AMS webpage, an enhanced database, and a communications plan to keep members informed about board actions, special events and new initiatives.

This progress is the work of many people, more than can be recognized in this report. However, special recognition is appropriate for Ted Leinbaugh's extensive efforts during his two-year term as President. We also are most grateful to Bob Gray for taking a leadership role in the process of recruiting and launching the expanded board of directors. Finally, our progress would not have been possible without the advice and support of the Marshall Aid Commemoration Committee, the British Embassy and the various British Consulates. Special thanks go to Dominic Martin who has been "shoulder to shoulder" with the board and officers during the past two years, and we wish Dominic well in his new position in Paris.

The AMS has been applying its organizational strength to pursue its mission, which is as follows:

The Association of Marshall Scholars fosters personal and professional relationships among Marshall Scholars, supports and publicizes the aims of the Marshall Scholarship Program, and enhances the experience of Marshall Scholars studying in the United Kingdom, thereby strengthening the enduring relationship between the United Kingdom and the United States.

In furtherance of this mission, in the last twelve months the AMS has organized a number of regional and national events to bring Marshalls together. These events have been offered free of charge and have typically combined great company with one or more speakers on topics of current interest. Events have been held at Goldman Sachs in New York, Yale Law School, the Boston Consulate, the University of North Carolina and Atlanta, among other places. Often the events have included new or current scholars and have served as a helpful introduction of the new and current into the larger community of Marshall Scholars.

The AMS is also committed to enhancing the experience of the current scholars. Contributions to the AMS in excess of annual dues are being collected in a "special programs fund," the income of which is being used to provide "extras" for the current scholars. This year AMS will fund an evening for the current scholars at the Globe Theater followed by a dinner and is making a contribution in support of the current scholars' fundraising effort to benefit people in need in Darfur, details of which appear on page 3. In the coming year, the AMS will be seeking additional contributions to build the special program fund so that support for the current scholars can be expanded.

The Marshall Scholarship continues to be a most selective and prestigious recognition of our nation's most outstanding students. The list of recipients of Marshall Scholarships commencing in 2008 is on page 3. The many AMS members who volunteer their time in the selection process can witness to the exceptional quality of this year's Marshall Scholars.

Among the rewards of serving as officers of AMS is the opportunity to meet and work with many Marshall Scholars during the course of the year. We look forward to seeing many more of you as we continue our partnership during the coming year.

MARSHALL SCHOLARS CLASS OF 2006 PROJECT



Continuing a vital tradition of service started by the Marshall Scholar Class of 2002, the 2006 Scholars have sought to focus greater attention on the continuing Darfur crisis in both its political and humanitarian dimensions. In addition to meeting with politicians and policy makers from Britain and the United States and holding consciousness raising debates in partnership with the Rhodes Scholars in Oxford, the class joined forces with the London-based NGO Kids for Kids, the only aid organization with a sustained-presence in the rural villages of Darfur, to advance a sustainable development model at the village level that can outlast the conflict. Partnering with the conflict-affected village of Kerkeria in Northern Darfur, the Scholars continue to raise the funds necessary to provide long-term development assets of livestock, seeds, water pumps, farming implements, veterinary care, and medical training and supplies to villagers. A series of Scholar-led fundraisers in Edinburgh, London, and Oxford culminated in a 1,000-mile cycle tour by Scholars of the British Isles in April 2008, featuring visits to schools and churches along the way to speak about Darfur, and receiving coverage in the American media.
